

Job Description Social Worker

VISION

SUMMARY/OBJECTIVE: The position of Social Worker provides advocacy and access to services on behalf of clients and their families. In addition, the Social Worker will maintain records, relay information, and help with other tasks as assigned. Duties will be performed in compliance with the National Association of Social Workers' Code of Ethics.

REPORTS TO: Director of Therapeutic Programs

JOB CLASSIFICATION: Exempt (Full-time)

SUPERVISES: None

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Exemplify a vibrant Christian faith personally and professionally. The individual fulfilling this role
 will protect the credibility of Bethel Bible Village's mission by complying with the Bethel Bible
 Village Standard of Conduct setting an example, in words and actions that are consistent with
 the values and beliefs of Bethel Bible Village.
- Be a Christ-like role model.
- Maintain prompt and regular attendance.
- When possible and applicable attend and volunteer at Bethel events and activities.
- Work with clients, families, and appropriate community agencies to coordinate and facilitate services for clients.
- Advocate for residents.
- Participate in planning treatment programs, and dispositional and discharge plans.
- Maintain family contact regarding client adjustments.
- Attend and facilitate staff, team, and department meetings.
- Attend in-services, staffing, and other meetings with the supervisor's approval.
- Actively participate in a team review of records and cases.
- Provide selected agency services to identified caseload; refer clients and families to other services as appropriate.
- Facilitate outside therapies such as equine and pet-assisted.
- Transport clients to court and other appointments, as necessary.
- Develop and maintain client case records, plans, and reports.

- Develop, write, and update Individual Program Programs (IPP's) and preliminary plans.
- Participate in the intake/admission process/meetings.
- Take notes at team and houseparent meetings.
- Share in the "on-call" responsibility using a ministry cell phone.
- Discuss consequences with the residents and suggest alternative behaviors.
- May supervise a Social Worker Intern.
- Review daily logs to monitor the client's behavior and progress.
- Attend foster care review board (FCRB) and court and prepare court reports and foster care review board summaries. Testify as needed.
- Distribute copies of report cards and Individual Program Plans (IPP's) to parents or guardians.
- Train clients in Toxic Shock Syndrome and sex abuse awareness and prevention topics.
- Apply for and maintain TennCare coverage for each client as needed.
- Ensure Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) compliance.
- Coordinate all medication management for clients.
- Develop and implement independent living classes for all clients age 14+.
- Develop and facilitate Parent Path Education classes/groups for families.
- Participate as a member of the treatment team in client interventions.
- Distribute mail to cottages/residents.
- Collaborate/partner with community resources to provide access to events/activities for the children.
- Communicate with guardians.
- Collaborate between medical services, school services, guardians, and cottage staff.
- Provide crisis intervention and safety assessments as needed.
- It is expected that professional and technical knowledge will be maintained by attending educational workshops; reviewing professional publications; establishing personal networks; participating in professional societies.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- <u>Spiritual</u>: Be an active participating member in a local Christian church. In accordance with the Mission of Bethel Bible Village, will share the gospel with children in our care, as well as their families, to help them know and respond to the love of God in Christ.
- <u>Education</u>: This position is title protected and requires a candidate with a Master of Social Work (MSW) degree.
- <u>Requirements</u>: The minimum age requirement for this position is 21 years of age. A candidate must successfully pass a drug screen, TB test, and physical exam.
- <u>Specific Skills/Requirements</u>: One year of pertinent experience in the human services field with children or in a residential treatment setting is required. Effective oral and written communication skills, and excellent interpersonal skills are required. Previous computer experience preferred. Experience with children and youth impacted by trauma and family crises highly preferred.
- Specialized Knowledge, Licenses, etc.: A valid driver's license is required.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS- The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job.

- Frequently sits for several hours.
- Frequently climbs stairs.
- Often responds to the phone, and communicates with staff and residents.
- Occasionally lifts, carries, or otherwise moves and positions objects weighing up to ten pounds when stocking supplies.
- Occasionally operates a vehicle.
- Visually, audibly, or by scent will identify probable emergency situations within the cottage.
